Note: As long as the staff from the Home Institution have sighted the original copy of the transcript, a certification/additional signing is not required. An email of the document sent directly to us will suffice.

#### English Language Requirement

- 1. Please note that students are required to meet the <u>English Language Requirements</u> for the MQ Study Abroad program.
- 2. Depending on the institution and country of residence, students will either be required to undertake an approved English Language test OR may use their High School results (within a 5-year validity period from commencement at Macquarie) to meet the requirement. Please note that this information is stated clearly on the English Language Requirements page.

Note: Letters of Proficiency will <u>NOT</u> suffice in place of the requirement listed on the <u>English Language</u> <u>Requirements page</u>.

#### **Requirements from Students**

As part of the application via our **StudyLink Portal**, students are required to upload the following:

- Copy of students' passport
- Academic transcripts: Academic transcripts of current degree as well as Undergraduate Degree if applying for the Postgraduate Study Abroad program
- Proof of English proficiency as stated on our English Language Requirements page
- Indicate the number of units they would like to undertake.
- Nominate specific units you would like to take at Macquarie University.

Weighted Average Mark (WAM) requirement:

- Non-Law students = 60
- Law students = 65



### English Language Requirements

#### **English Language Tests**

The minimum English entry requirement that applies to most undergraduate or postgraduate courses is:

- IELTS Academic: 6.5 overall with 6.0 in each band
- TOEFL iBT: 83 overall, R: 13, W:21, L: 12, S:18
   Only for tests taken from 5 May 2024, these results are valid for
   Australian visa purposes. Otherwise, any TOEFL iBT tests undertaken
   between 26 July 2023 to 4 May 2024 will not be accepted. See the
   English language visa requirements page.
- PTE Academic: 58 overall, minimum 52 in each band
- Cambridge English (C1A or C2P): 180 overall, 169 in each band
- Occupational English Test (OET): R: C+, W: C+, L: C/C+, S: C/C+

#### Please note:

- Some academic programs have specific entry requirements higher than the minimum. Refer to our <u>English Requirements page</u> for more information.
- All English language test scores must be less than two years old at the date of course commencement at Macquarie.

#### Qualification with English as the Language of Instruction

The University may accept as meeting English proficiency requirements:

- Recognised qualifications from specified English-speaking countries or regions where English was the language of instruction; or
- Qualifications from specific countries with English as an approved subject.

## Choosing your units

Unit Guide: information about staff contacts, learning outcomes, assessment tasks, delivery and resources.

Course Handbook: unit overview, level, offerings, pre-requisites, learning outcomes, assessments, learning and teaching activities.

You can select and study units from any of our faculties. While selecting the units, you must consider the following:

- Units are offered in the enrolled semesters:
  - o Session 1: February to June, OR
  - o Session 2: July December
- Students cannot enrol in units that are not offered at their level of study (i.e. Undergraduate students can only enrol in undergraduate units. Postgraduate students can only enrol in postgraduate units).
  - O Undergraduate level (UG) = 1000, 2000 and 3000 level units
  - O Postgraduate level (PG) = 6000, 8000 and 9000 level
- You must ensure that you have met the academic equivalent prerequisites at your home university for the units you want to enrol in.
- You must have approval from your home university to enrol in the units you choose.

Postgraduate students: Please note that 6000 level units are foundational units which might have been covered in your undergraduate degree in the same field.



## Programs with Special Entry Requirements

Postgraduate Law School: Students must have completed 180 ECTS to be admitted to the postgraduate Study Abroad Law program. Students can study 8000-level units.

Bachelor of Clinical Science: Admission to units in this degree is not guaranteed and is subject to a cap. Please send the unit request approval before applying to the program to: Faculty of Medicine, Health and Human Sciences E: MMS.coursesupport@mq.edu.au **Important** Once the number of units in the package are approved by the corresponding Faculty, irrespective of which units from those nominated, an offer will be issued. considerations O Unit selection changes (i.e. wanting to nominate/be assessed for units other than those approved) can only be made after the student accepts their offer. To do so, the student will need to submit a request via AskMQ independently. More information on making changes will be provided once the offer has been accepted. If students want to change the number of units they study (3 or 4 Units), they MUST advise our Admissions team in writing prior to accepting the offer, so a new offer can be issued. Once the offer has been accepted, the number of units selected to study cannot be changed, and the student will be liable for the full tuition fee

for the chosen program

## Coming to Australia and Studying at Macquarie
